




Sustainable Living

Our young environmentalists transformed their old t-shirts into stylish and functional recycle bags. With a little bit of cutting and knotting, their shirts got a new life as reusable bags, perfect for carrying books, toys, bottles, and swimsuits. This hands-on activity sparked their creativity and taught them the importance of reusing materials to reduce waste.





The learners showcased their ingenuity by repurposing old shoe boxes into first aid kits and colourful pencil holders. They decorated the boxes with eco-friendly materials, turning them into beautiful and functional items for their homes and classrooms. This activity highlighted the endless possibilities of reusing everyday objects. They acknowledged the difference between disposable items and their reusable alternatives in daily life and ways to save plants, energy, and water daily. They enjoyed the Walkathon from the school to Swayambhunath, holding their placards with the message "Save Mother Earth."





























During the week, they were engaged in various class activities. Our learners were enthusiastic to share the concept of the 5Rs: Reuse, Reduce, Recycle, Rethink, Refuse and its importance. They participated in discussions and projects that emphasised each of these principles. 



They demonstrated how combining different perspectives can lead to more prosperous, more innovative ideas.







































"Grade 4 Learners Master Metacognition in Tower Building Challenge"

On June 7th, 2024, Grade 4 learners participated in an exciting Tower Building Challenge, an integral part of their International Primary Curriculum (IPC) unit on Brainwave Metacognition. This challenge was designed to emphasise the significance of the 8 Personal Learning Goals: Adaptable, Communicator, Collaborator, Resilient, Respectful, Ethical, Thinker and Empathetic.





During the challenge, students were tasked with constructing a tower at least 30 centimetres tall using Jenga blocks. This activity required them to engage in various stages of planning, monitoring, and evaluating their progress, thus enhancing their metacognitive skills. As they worked on their towers, students had to think critically and collaborate effectively, demonstrating and reflecting on how each Personal Learning Goal played a role in their success.





























After the activity, the learners reflected on their experiences, discussing which Personal Learning Goals they found most straightforward to follow and which were more challenging. This reflection helped them understand the practical applications of these goals in a hands-on context.





The activity was a resounding success, with learners achieving the objective of building the tower and thoroughly enjoying the process. They gained valuable insights into their learning processes and the importance of personal development goals, making the Tower Building Challenge a memorable and educational experience.































Outdoor Learning, a visit to Girija Prasad Koirala Park

Grade 5 learners had an amazing outdoor learning trip to Girija Prasad Park, Budhanilkantha, where they enjoyed a fruitful and productive day brimming with educational experiences. They discovered pollinators' crucial role in our ecosystem, participated in a spirited cleaning campaign, and engaged in thoughtful discussions about our environment and climate action plans. The park's beautiful setting allowed the students to observe various leaves and explore different plant species and their unique characteristics. Throughout the trip, the learners demonstrated resilience, adaptability, and critical thinking, embracing challenges and enthusiastically adapting to new situations. They capped off their day with fun outdoor activities, which provided enjoyment and fostered camaraderie among them. Overall, the trip to Girija Prasad Park was a resounding success, offering our Grade 5 students invaluable learning experiences and creating beautiful memories that will last a lifetime.































"Unleashing Potential: Embracing a Growth Mindset"

In a recent exploration of fixed and growth mindsets, Grade 5 learners embarked on skill-based tasks like Nepali story sequencing, solving puzzles, making shapes using tangrams and arranging sentences related to Growth and Fixed Mindsets under the appropriate heading. Some encountered easy challenges, while others faced more formidable hurdles. Despite the difficulties, these young learners showcased remarkable resilience, refusing to give up until their tasks were complete.









































The essence of fixed versus growth mindsets was vividly portrayed throughout the journey. Those with straightforward tasks chose growth over complacency, while those with complex challenges demonstrated unwavering determination.







This educational experience underscored the importance of resilience and the power of a growth mindset in overcoming obstacles. As educators, it reminds us of the profound impact of nurturing these qualities in our students, empowering them to navigate the complexities of learning with confidence and perseverance.































Discovering the World of Mixtures

Our Grade 5 learners set off on an intriguing scientific adventure to investigate the realm of mixtures. After learning about mixtures, they began by learning about the two main kinds of mixtures: homogeneous and heterogeneous. A homogeneous mixture, like salt dissolved in water, has evenly distributed components that appear as a single substance. In contrast, a heterogeneous mixture, such as a salad, has unevenly distributed elements, allowing you to see the different parts. This foundational knowledge set the stage for hands-on experiments to separate various mixtures.





The highlight of their exploration was conducting experiments to separate mixtures using different methods. The learners began with hand-picking to separate different types of cereals, a simple yet effective technique for visibly distinct items. They then moved on to sedimentation and decantation, where they mixed sand and water, observed the sand settling at the bottom, and carefully poured out the water. This demonstrated how denser substances settle while lighter ones can be removed. Additionally, they used filtration to separate mixtures of liquids and insoluble solids, such as water and sand. By pouring the mixture through a funnel lined with filter paper, they observed the liquid passing through while the solid remained, illustrating the effectiveness of filtration.



























Throughout these experiments, the learners also became acquainted with essential scientific tools. They used beakers to hold and mix liquids, funnels to guide substances into containers with small openings, and stirring rods to mix solutions evenly. These tools facilitated the experiments and introduced the students to the equipment commonly used in scientific investigations. The hands-on approach engaged the learning process and provided a practical understanding of how mixtures can be separated in real-life scenarios. The experience was both fun and educational, sparking a keen interest in scientific exploration among the students and leaving them eager for more scientific adventures in the future.

- Cuboid House secured the 4th position gracefully, adding their unique shine to the event.






























Euro Cup Interschool Basketball Tournament
