The day was filled with blessings, joyful faces, excitement, and cheer as the budding stars of Early Years showered their grandparents with love and affection.
















































### Early Years celebrates Tihar






















### Seeing the Light






















### Exploring the Importance of Water Conservation


Through such experiences, learners build empathy and become globally conscious individuals committed to supporting Sustainable Development Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation for All.











































## Learning, exploration and friendship in Chitwan!






















### Grand Gorkha Glory










































#### Joyous Journey to India

Overall, the trip was a wonderful blend of learning and adventure, helping our students grow in resilience, respect, and communication while gaining a deeper appreciation of the world around them!
















































### Chain of Kindness: Anti-Bullying Activity


