




▶ Trip to the Museum

Shivapuri Camping for Grade 11

Learners of Grade 11 journeyed to Shivapuri National park as a part of their yearly adventurous journey. The 2 night three days trip was filled with action, fun, and team spirit from April 6-8, 2022. This exhilarating expedition took our learners to walk, scramble, swim, and bush hike through the forest, rivers, and plunge pools, for a journey of a lifetime.

Day I started with an introduction to solid rock abseiling, where they were briefed on the rope works and safety measures. The activity began with vigorous 4 hours of training and then to waterfall canyoning in the afternoon where our learners started with a 50 m high abseil point with waterfalls through a narrow deep canyon.

Experienced and qualified guides led our learners making sure each section of the descent was navigated safely, whether it was descending a rockslide, or jumping into a pool. The learners had to master amazing abseiling points and cool jumps and slides with fun and teamwork! Definitely a fun canyon for sports classes & teachers!

On Day 2, our learners went on a 6-hours orienteering hike to the Shivapuri National Park. They started the hike from Sundarijal and from there had to hike and find their way on a route to Dab village with the help of a map. This provided them with an opportunity to learn and explore their communication skills with the locals to find their way.

The hardest part of the walk was hiking up the steep narrow path to the top of the hill. The students certainly learned the value of good orienteering, leadership, and teamwork. The students performed well and showed enthusiasm, stamina, and commitment to complete the hike. The most rewarding time was when all the learners reached Dab, the camping site for the night.
