
























A Journey to Remember!

Aligned with the Science and Technology curriculum's focus on Biodiversity and Solid Waste Management, this activity highlighted the pressing need for responsible waste management. 






















- Embracing Adventure and Growth in Ghandruk and Landruk






















Painting a brighter tomorrow with violence-less colour

Professional Development Session for Continuous Improvement

On Sunday, December 22, 2024, a highly engaging and insightful Professional Development (PD) session was conducted for our school's primary and secondary teachers. The session was led by a distinguished panel comprising Unit Head of Primary, Ms. Shreeti Khadka, Programme Officer, Ms. Anita Shrestha, Coordinator, Ms. Dikshya Lamichhaney, and Unit Head of Secondary, Ms. Khushboo Rawat. These facilitators shared their valuable insights, experiences, and learnings acquired during the ICA conference held in Malaysia in November 2024.

The session revolved around empowering educators to prepare learners for the future by integrating innovative methodologies and tools into teaching. One of the key highlights was the role of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in modern teaching practices. The trainers emphasised how AI can be leveraged to make classrooms more dynamic, interactive, and future-ready. Discussions also included ways to promote learner agency, encouraging learners to take ownership of their learning in class and at home. Teachers were introduced to innovative assessment strategies beyond traditional methods to foster creativity, critical thinking, and practical application among learners.



































Another crucial aspect of the training was advocating for sustainable practices in schools. The facilitators stressed the importance of instilling environmentally conscious habits in learners and integrating sustainability into everyday learning activities.

For secondary teachers, a particular focus was placed on the International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC). The session included a detailed discussion of the recent updates to the IMYC framework and how these changes could be effectively implemented in classrooms. Teachers were encouraged to enhance their IMYC practices to align with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and nurture learner agency in regular classes.

The PD session provided a platform for teachers to reflect on their teaching strategies and adapt to innovative approaches to meet the evolving needs of 21st-century learners. Our educators' commitment to continuous improvement and professional growth is commendable and reflects our school's dedication to excellence in education.































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
