






Solid Shapes

The world is made up of shapes and colours. Learning about shapes not only helps learners identify them but also helps them understand other signs and symbols. To make learning about these solid shapes fun, learners of Grade 1 were given the opportunity to learn in a practical hands-on environment during their Math class. The learners were asked to create solid shapes using different household materials like flour dough, toothpicks, sticks, and paper. 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

यसरी हामीले छठ पर्वको बारेमा भर्चुअल कक्षामा छलफल ञऱ्यौँ।





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
▶ We Are What We Eat

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▶ The Nature of Life

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On Friday, December 3, 2021, Grade 4 learners visited the Science Laboratory to observe the museum specimens of Vertebrates and Invertebrates under the IPC unit, "The Nature of Life." They were very excited to collect information and facts about different specimens. As investigators and explorers, they discussed and recorded the characteristics of vertebrates and invertebrates. They also did thorough research and created a Venn diagram where they compared and contrasted vertebrates and invertebrates. Considering the research details, they created informative booklets with illustrations and facts about various species independently. Learners were truly thrilled to explore different species and build on their learning skills.



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Exit Point of 'The Nature of Life'

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"Creativity"


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"Let today's strong performance be the starting point for tomorrow." — Ron Kaufman

They were also curious to learn about the flight controller and accessories, which included the types of sensors like gyroscopes, barometers, and accelerometers, etc. Learners also came to know about the software and log analysis required in this field. This session was a great opportunity for our learners to understand more about drones.

Learners of grade 9 were fortunate to have a workshop on UAV (Unmanned Aerial Vehicle aka Drones) given by Mr. Satish Chaudhary. The workshop was scheduled an hour per day which included Design and Development of Multi- Rotor Vehicles and its real world usage. Learners got a chance to experiment various components and circuits of UAV. The trainer provided information on the working mechanism and functions of the components in UAV. Under the supervision of the trainer the learners built the body, created circuits and assembled different components in the body to make a UAV. The learners had great fun discussing the work of sensors like Accelerometer and Gyroscopes along with the Hand-on Experience on DC motors and ESCS (Electronic Speed Controllers). The trainer taught how to fly the drone made by the learners themselves. They were fortunate since it was an exhilarating experience for each learner to fly their self-made drone. In conclusion, it was a life learning experience for the learners to be involved and engaged in such a production which unleashed their creativity and critical thinking skills. Learners were grateful since it was a great opportunity that our School was able to conduct this session and a big applause to Mr. Satish Chaudhary for such an interesting and creative session.









► Model Sustainable City

The young minds of Grade 10 utilized the opportunity to develop the concept of sustainable development while working on the project, 'Model Sustainable City,' in Social Studies. They were given the autonomy to think, imagine, and work on a model sustainable city. This autonomy and project work has promoted the development of the knowledge, skills, understanding, values, and actions required to create a sustainable world that ensures environmental protection and conservation along with urban prosperity. The shared values and principles that underpin sustainable development could be seen in their model cities where they added proper roads, residential areas, industrial areas, greenery, and the use of alternative energy.











Tales and Tradition

Grade 11 recently read an essay on the oral tradition by Frank LaPena—a Native American artist, researcher, professor, poet, and writer—from the unit, Sharing Tradition. The essay talks about the importance of sharing oral stories. It highlights the role of the younger generation in passing on the tales that have been narrated by their elders to preserve and respect tradition. Grade 11 applied the concepts from LaPena's essay to their personal lives and conducted their own oral tradition research at home. They interviewed at least one elder from their family and listened to their ancestral stories. Following this, the learners created presentations to showcase their cultural discoveries. On December 20, 2021, they presented their research findings and discussed their families' unique cultural traditions like Ihi, Bel Bibaha, Indra Jatra, and interpretations of Dashain and Korean New Year. The learners also shared pictures and videos that they had collected and created. Finally, they wrote narrative essays explaining their research and findings in detail. This task helped the learners explain their own distinct customs, explore others' traditions and values, and engage with the text they read in a more personal manner.

"How to be an Effective Teacher?"

On December 29, 2021, our School Director, Ms. Diptee Acharya, hosted an informative workshop for the teachers of grades 1–11 to discuss the five major skills required for an instructor to become an effective teacher. All the teachers who were expected to attend were sent a short video on the topic several days before the training. They were asked to watch and reflect on the video's content prior to the session.

During the training, the attending teachers were divided into five different groups and were assigned a particular skill to discuss from the video. These included Instructional Designer, Creator of Learning Experiences, Attention Manager, Effective Communicator, and Constant Learner. Each group was requested to prepare a short presentation on the topic they had been allocated and discuss ways in which they were embodying that skill or trait in their classrooms. The groups were also asked to explore additional actions they could take to improve their own teaching.

The presentations that the groups prepared touched upon activities and techniques from multiple classrooms and the session became a platform where teachers from different backgrounds could hear and learn from one another. Towards the end of the training, Ms. Acharya reviewed the concepts that had been explored, further elaborating on them with numerous examples. In addition to it being an educational few hours, the workshop also became a robust example for the concept of 'Flipped classroom.' Moreover, the teachers were wearing the shoes of the learners and actively taking their learning into their own hands. They did so by firstly, understanding and reflecting over content independently, and then discussing it with the class and the facilitator to enhance their educational experience. Overall, the session served as a noteworthy beginning for all teachers to reflect on themselves and their work and improve their skills in the terms to come.



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
