### Brain Boosters: Training Minds and Traveling the World!

On June 10, 2025, our Grade 1 learners delved deeper into their IPC unit "Brainwave: The Brain," discovering how their most powerful organ works and how to care for it. Through engaging activities, they explored optimal learning strategies and brain health practices.

As part of our international task, learners virtually traveled to Scotland and the UAE to examine cultural approaches to wellness. In Scotland, they learned about traditional foods like porridge and haggis, and how time in green spaces promotes mental clarity. Their UAE exploration revealed the nutritional benefits of dates and biryani, highlighting diverse paths to physical and mental health. This global perspective helped students recognize universal connections between healthy habits and strong brains.

During their brain science studies, learners investigated how different brain regions control learning, movement, emotions, and thinking. Teachers guided interactive lessons about how sleep, nutrition, and daily routines impact cognitive function. Children practiced identifying habits that keep their brains "strong and happy," gaining practical self-care knowledge.

Physical Education directly supported this unit through targeted activities. Learners developed gross motor skills while stretching for flexibility, jogging to build stamina, and practicing catching/throwing to enhance coordination. These exercises reinforced a key unit concept: physical activity primes the brain for learning.
























































































### Grade 2 Exit Point: Celebrating Learning through Metacognition

Our enthusiastic Grade 2 learners recently marked the conclusion of their first IPC unit, Brainwave: Metacognition on June 26, 2025 with a joyful and meaningful Exit Point celebration. The event was a vibrant showcase of their learning journey, offering insight into how they understand and reflect on the ways they learn best.

Throughout the unit, our young metacognitive explorers developed a solid grasp of how the brain functions. They confidently identified key parts of the human brain and their roles, explained the difference between the left and right hemispheres, and articulated their understanding of thinking tools such as growth mindset, thinking skills, and different types of questions—ranging from memory and evaluative to convergent and divergent.

The event was truly special with the way learners took ownership of the experience. They stepped confidently into the role of facilitators, guiding parents and visitors through a variety of interactive activities. From Kim's Game and the Stroop Effect to Memory Challenges, every activity was led by the students, who not only explained the rules but also the thinking strategies behind them. Their leadership and clarity were inspiring to witness.







































Complementing the hands-on activities were thoughtful displays of learners' work, including creative brain models, reflective art pieces, and emotion exploration activities in Nepali. These provided deeper insight into how learners understand memory, emotion, and the cognitive strategies that support meaningful learning.

The event was a powerful reminder of the confidence, collaboration, and curiosity that define our learners. We are incredibly proud of their efforts and the metacognitive tools they now carry with them. # Exploring Living History at Bhaktapur Durbar Square

On June 3, 2025, our Grade 3 learners stepped into the heart of history with an enriching field trip to Bhaktapur Durbar Square. This visit was part of their Brainwave unit, which encourages students to explore learning through multiple lenses — including history, geography, art, and design. It was a day designed to take learning beyond textbooks, bringing classroom concepts to life through real-world experience.

As learners entered the UNESCO World Heritage site, they were instantly captivated by the grandeur around them — from centuries-old temples and finely carved wooden windows to vibrant courtyards and age-worn sculptures. With sketchbooks and thoughtful questions in hand, they explored the square with wide-eyed curiosity, ready to uncover the stories etched into every stone and statue.

Throughout the day, learners viewed Bhaktapur through the eyes of young historians, geographers, artists, and designers. They reflected on the legacy of the Malla period, examined how the city's layout supported its community over time, and sketched architectural details that revealed the exceptional craftsmanship of the past. Each discipline added a new layer of understanding, showing how different ways of seeing can enrich how we learn.

One of the most meaningful moments came through interactions with local artisans and community members, who generously shared their traditions, techniques, and experiences. These personal connections helped students see Bhaktapur not just as a preserved monument, but as a living, breathing heritage site — still shaping lives today.

More than a field trip, the visit gave learners space to observe, think, and engage in ways the classroom doesn't always allow. It brought their learning into focus — specific, tangible, and connected to the world beyond school.

On Thursday, June 19, 2025, the Grade 4 learners transformed their space into a vibrant hub of discovery, proudly presenting their Exit Point for the International Primary Curriculum (IPC) unit "Brainwave: Metacognition." Centered on the compelling theme "The Art and Science of Learning," the exhibition offered a unique window into the students' understanding of how they learn best, presented with remarkable creativity and confidence.

Parents and visitors were treated to an interactive journey through the students' learning. The event buzzed with engagement as young learners articulately explained their discoveries across various subjects. The atmosphere was one of palpable pride as learners demonstrated not just knowledge, but deep reflection on the learning process itself.











































The exhibition highlighted diverse aspects of learning through hands-on activities in each subject:

- Mathematics: Applied math skills to analyze real sugar consumption versus healthy recommendations.
- Social Studies: Demonstrated social studies concepts by quizzing parents on learning goals and growth vs. fixed mindsets.
- Nepali: Reinforced language skills through an interactive memory game.
- Art: Illustrated color theory fundamentals via the color wheel and hands-on mixing demonstrations.
- Physical Education: Highlighted PE's role in well-being by explaining exercise's impact on emotion management and the "Zones of Regulation."

Adding a dynamic element, a group of learners performed an insightful short skit on conflict resolution, demonstrating practical social-emotional skills, warmly received by the audience despite its informal staging.








































### Grade 8 Takes on the Climbing Wall


#### What Happened

# Future-Proofing with Math: Grade 10 Tackles Compound Interest

On June 13, the Grade 10 learners stepped away from standard math exercises and into a practical, hands-on workshop that brought the concept of compound interest into sharp focus. Held in the school's Math Lab as part of a math enrichment program, the session used interactive, scenario-based learning to make this essential financial concept both accessible and relevant.

Working in small groups, learners were given real-life scenarios involving personal savings, investments, and budgeting—like planning a college fund, saving for a trip, or investing in a small business. With the help of calculators, spreadsheets, and online tools, they explored how different interest rates and time periods could dramatically change the outcome of each financial plan.

Instead of just plugging numbers into a formula, learners were encouraged to analyze, compare, and interpret results. They quickly discovered how compound interest isn't just about bigger numbers—it's about time, strategy, and smart decision-making. Discussions naturally emerged around topics like delayed gratification, long-term planning, and the value of saving early.

The activity didn't just reinforce the math behind compound interest—it helped learners visualize its impact in everyday life. Many walked away with a clearer understanding of how small, consistent savings can grow significantly over time, and how this knowledge could apply to their own financial futures.

By turning abstract math into applied problem-solving, the session made space for meaningful learning—and sparked conversations that extended well beyond the classroom.




















#### Semi Finals: The Heat Is On

From Early Years to Grade 10, our learners embraced this year's theme—Ending Plastic Pollution—while expanding their impact to broader environmental stewardship. Creativity, critical thinking, and handson action merged as learners tackled waste, biodiversity, and ecosystems with purpose.

Early Years: Planted saplings, transformed trash into art, engineered water filters from reused jars, and crafted "nature hairstyles" with twigs and flowers.



























Grade 1: Crafted paper bags and decorated bottles after pollution-awareness videos.

Grade 2: Championed the 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) through collaborative booklets and storytelling.

Grade 3: Grew plants in recycled bottles and staged the skit "From Trash to Treasure Garden."

Grade 4: Led a Swayambhu cleanup, designed green pledges, and created eco-logos.

Grade 5: Upcycled waste into bird feeders and debated recycling as "Waste Detectives."

Grade 6: Built water filters, ran plastic-swap drives, and turned creek trash into art.

Grade 7: Produced viral eco-TikToks, painted murals on reused canvas, and funded turtle rescues via a "Green Market."

Grade 8: Audited plastic footprints, petitioned authorities, and led school cleanups.

Grade 9: Tracked waste using the 4Rs, explored biodiversity at ICIMOD, and designed "Save the Ocean" posters.

Grade 10: Surveyed household plastic use, spearheaded a Swayambhu cleanup, and showcased findings in an exhibition.

### Greening the Future: Sanskriti's Tree Plantation Drive

On June 8, 2025, Sanskriti International School marked World Environment Day with a tree plantation initiative near UN Park, Shankhamul — a meaningful collaboration with the Jane Goodall Institute Nepal.
